## **AEEP's Monitoring Role**

- As a forum for partnership and political dialogue between the continents, AEEP, through its secretariat is ideally placed to monitor progress of energy sector developments in Africa through Africa-EU partnership activities.
- AEEP is also involved in key high-level political processes and have close working relationships with organizations such as SE4ALL, AREI, G7 and G20 processes
- Targets set in 2010, Stakeholders mandated the AEEP to monitor progress of European and African efforts towards sustainable energy generation

## Monitoring the AEEP 2020 Targets

- Monitoring of the Targets allows for the identification of successful efforts, analysis of gaps and lags in progress and keeping both parties accountable to commitments.
- **Baseline report** established in 2010, **First Status Report** published in 2014.
- Significant developments in the sector, and new focus from the climate context have prompted a review of the targets
- AEEP initiated an intermediate review of the status, to help inform a proceeding discussion on the **need to review the targets**, hence the **2016 status report**

## Mapping of Energy Initiatives and Programs

- In 2015, AEEP initiated a consultative discussion series with key stakeholders on the topic of coordination.
- Stakeholders agreed on the need for coordination and a need for a mapping to explain “who is doing what?”
- AEEP was requested by partners to initiate mapping as a key input to the AUC’s pan-African coordination framework
- **Objective: present information about Partner initiatives promoting energy in Africa in a systematic approach, allowing for better coordination and results**



## Approach

- Undertaken in a phased and consultative approach:
  - **Phase 1:** initial overview of key initiatives and programs,
  - **Phase 2:** the information and methodology was **verified and validated** by the representatives of included programmes
  - **Phase 3: analysis of data** and compilation of **key policy recommendations** on opportunities for collaboration and gaps in the sector

- *Need for a sustainability plan: to update mapping would be one of the central tasks of the planned Pan-African coordination platform*

## Launch of Reports

- Encourage stakeholders to make use of this information to help orient inform areas of interventions work and foster partnerships:
  1. ***Intermediate Status Report Update***: a comprehensive knowledge base on where we stand
  2. ***Mapping of Energy Initiatives***: a tool to contribute towards coordination
- **The mapping and status reports are *complementary*** in that they provide an overview of the state of play in the energy sector in Africa and allow policy makers and stakeholders alike to identify areas of progress, gaps and opportunities for collaboration.
